Hello everyone,

I must admit I went to the last AGM without the intention to embark on my third term as AUGC president.

Being the 25th Anniversary of the club this year, I feel it only appropriate to share some history with you this year as I write my reports. Anthony is working on a more detailed history of the club and the results of his efforts will be very interesting indeed!

My first term as President was about 1990-91. I'll have to check exactly which year. Second term was a short one in 1994. I took the reins from Anthony (hmmm becoming a habit this is) after his RAAF transfer to Melbourne until the next AGM.

The most significant thing I can remember about 1994 is that this was the year we bought the Puchatek. The Bocian had its accident and we were concerned that a long spell with only one two seater would have an adverse affect on the club. This was certainly true when the Bocian was out of the air from 1987 following its blow-over.



There was a meeting in the corridors of Telstra that looked just like any other normal meeting at that time and not at all like the meeting between President and Treasurer that it really was (gee Dennis, have you really been treasurer that long!) Dennis and I worked out all the details and financial arrangements and by the following summer we had out beautiful brand new Puchatek.

Congratulations to **Matt** and **Brett** for going solo in the Puchatek and converting to the Arrow.

Congratulations also to **Scott Lewis** for experiencing the delights of the Pik and to **Derek Spencer** for getting his passenger-friendly rating and also being signed out for loops.

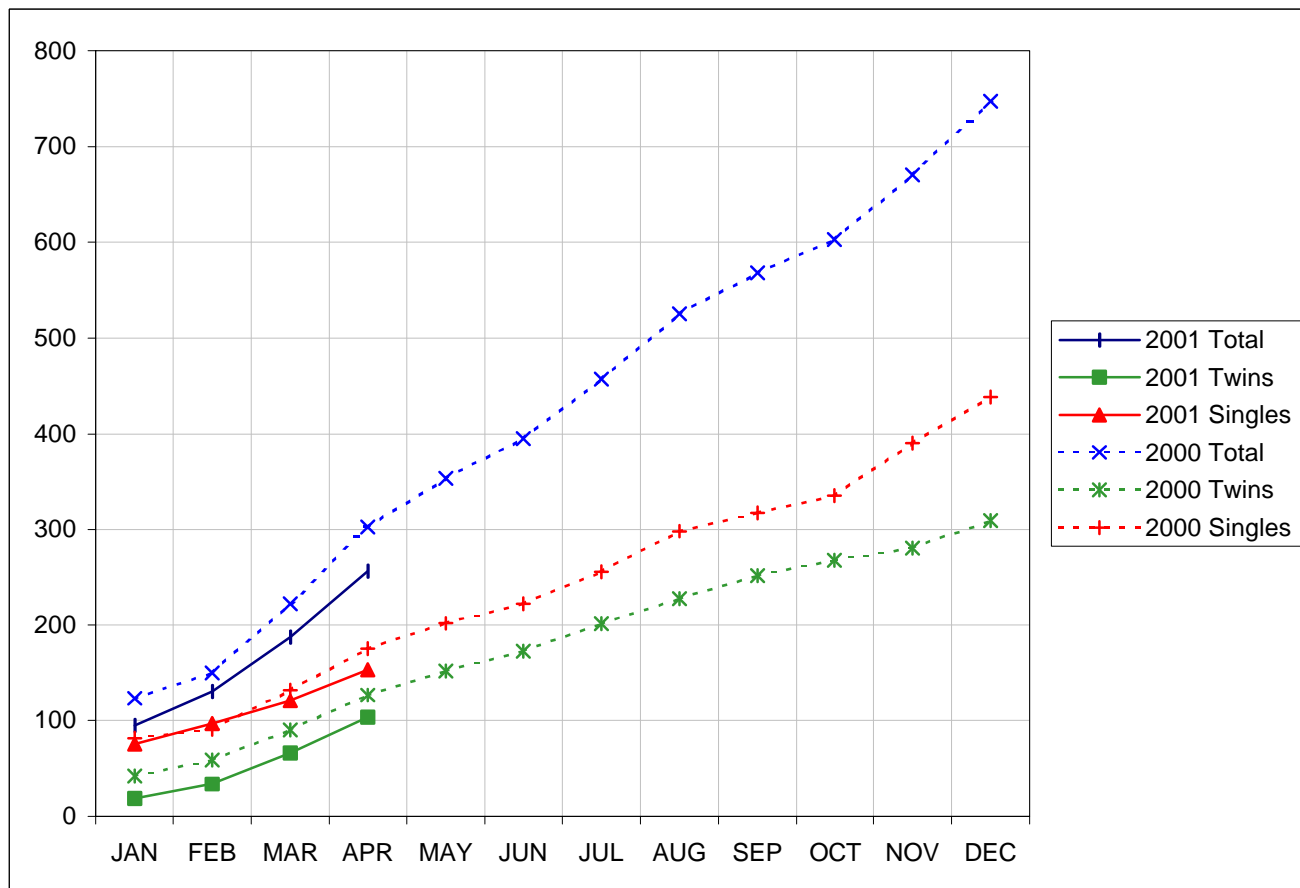

"But it has operational implications."

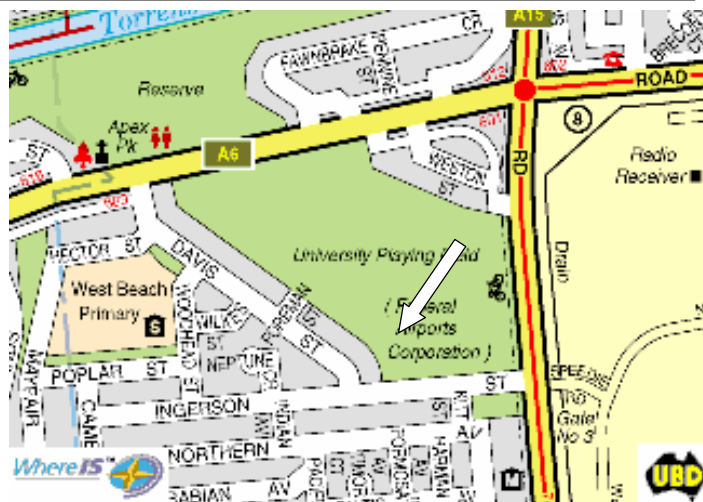
"Nevertheless, the executive always deals with it."
