#### **CFI Report**

#### AUGC's 2006 Biennial Ops Check

AUGC received loving care and attention from the South Australian RTO/Ops in late June.

The Ops check system is one of the ways that the GFA makes sure that gliding clubs in Australia aren't developing unsafe operational practices. Each gliding club receives a safety audit every two years, carried out by the RTO/Ops or some other delegated Level-3 instructor according to MOSP Pt 2 15.3.4.

Paul Mason is our current RTO/Ops. He arrived at Stonefield one Saturday in June to observe the way we work. During the course of the day he also gave me my annual check, and flew with Derek Spencer and Mark Tyler as representative standards of AUGC's instructors and locally-trained pilots.

The result of the check was a written report, which is available on the web at http://www.augc.on.net/ members/docs/reports/2006-06-17-ops-check.pdf. I'd recommend that all members read it and take away whatever lessons they can gain from it.

The report is a positive one, and all AUGC members who have contributed to the development of our operational standards are to be commended.

The major recommendation to come out of the report was associated with safety of members of the public who are attending our airfield. Paul felt that a clearer separation between "public" and "non-public" areas at the launchpoint could be conveyed by using a line of witches hats to delineate the boundary. There has been a suggestion since then that the 4 witches hats

#### **Progress on Joint Airfield Management**

Since last report, the Stonefield Aviation Association Inc. Constitution was agreed by the clubs and our application for incorporation of SAA was approved, so



we use around the winch cable tie-down area could be redeployed for this purpose: We've used them to mark out the hazard area around the cables for the uninitiated public, and if we're saying the whole launchpoint area is hazardous we might as well mark it as such.

#### Instructor revalidations

The GFA has released an Operational Directive which replaces those parts of the MOSP which cover instructor revalidations.

The new rules specify currency requirements on instructors who wish to maintain their rating, rather than specifying an arbitrary threshold of hours/launches which must be met every two years for revalidation.

This may result in a couple of AUGC instructors dropping off the list, but it'll also make it easier for some of those remaining to maintain their ratings.

SAA Inc. officially exists as of 27 July.

This will allow us to progress with the next phase of signing up insurance, banking, hangar licenses and other such details. Redmond is working on the necessary agreements for transfer of assets. It is now anticipated that full SAA operations will commence in September.

Handover of the clubhouse fridge operation occurs immediately. This has no impact on AUGC members' purchase of goods from the fridge – prices are unchanged and payment is still via the tally sheet or the fridge cash tray. 
