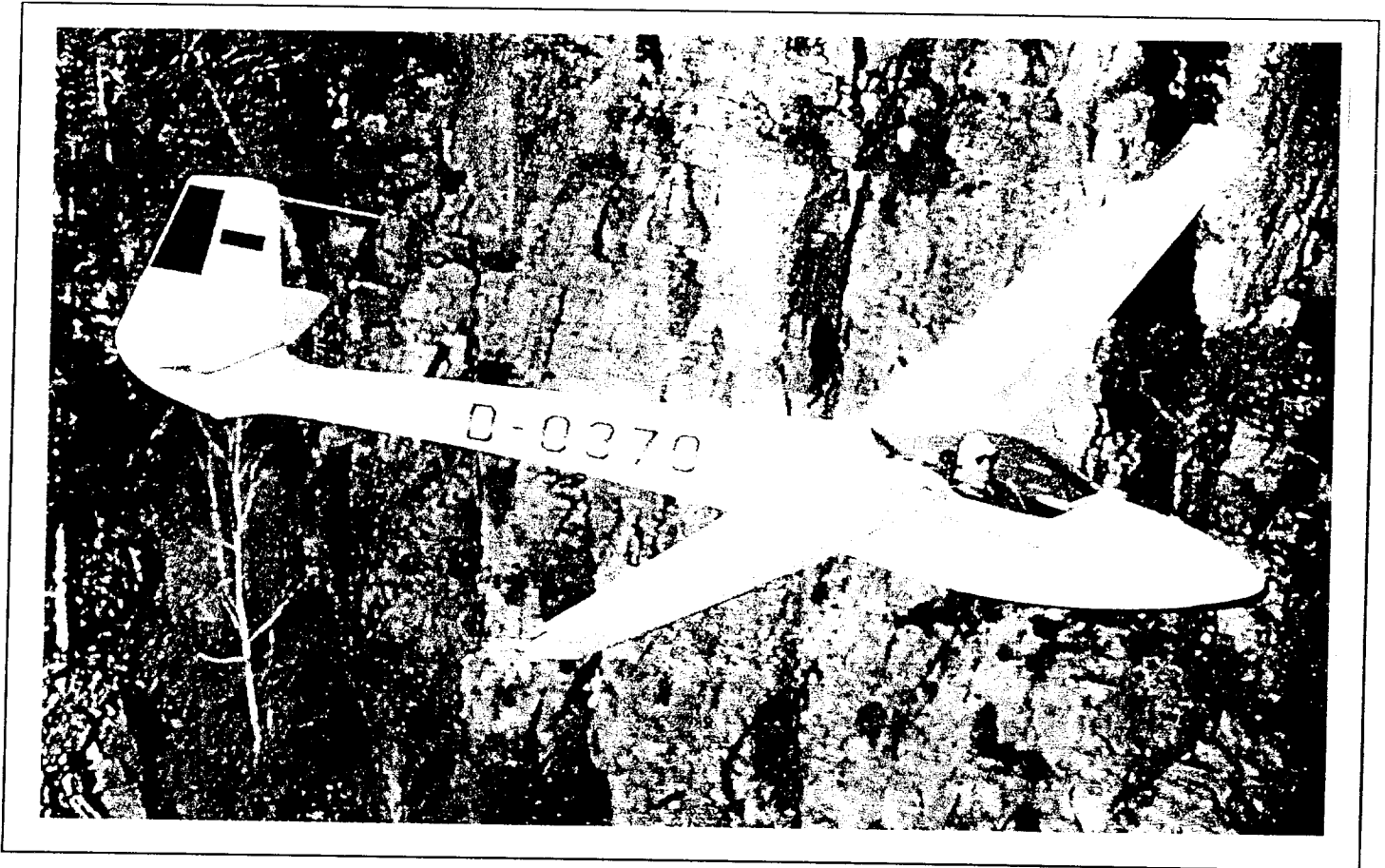

Visit the GRAMPIANS SOARING CLUB

AUGC will be visiting the Grampians over the June long weekend (12, 13 & 14th) for a wave camp hosted by the Grampians soaring club.

The location is at the eastern end of the Grampians in Victoria, accommodation at Lake Fyans, airstrip near Pomonal. The trip will be about 500Km each way. Accommodation is available in 3 buildings (inc. toilets / showers / kitchen) which sleep about 20 people each. Please provide your own air mattress / bedding / Wellington boots. The Grampians Soaring Club will be providing morning and evening meals and wish a \$10 deposit to buy provisions. This should be given to Gary Hollands before 31/5/1993. The intention is to take a twin seater and GTJ and also possibly GCY (airworthiness permitting) along with the usual host of private aircraft. The operation will be mixed winch and aerotow and you should check with an instructor to see which aircraft you would fly. Contact in the first instance should be made to a club instructor.
